
LONG-TERM CONTROL MEDICINES



They help relieve muscle tightness over time, but do not relieve symptoms.

They work slowly over many days to do their job, so they are taken every day like a vitamin!



Corticosteroids decrease and prevent swelling:

Flovent® (fluticasone)

Diskus® (dry powder inhaler) or pump









Pulmicort® (budesonide) Turbuhaler® (dry powder inhaler) or Respules® for the nebulizer

Qvar® & Qvar Redihaler® (beclomethasone)







Asmanex® (mometasone)

Twisthaler® Dry powder inhaler Alvesco® (ciclesonide)

LONG-TERM CONTROL MEDICINES

Combination Inhalers contain a corticosteroid to control swelling and long-acting bronchodilator to relax muscles over time:



Advair® (fluticasone & salmeterol) Diskus® (dry powder inhaler)

Symbicort® (budesonide & formoterol)



Breo® (fluticasone vilanterol) Dry powder inhaler


